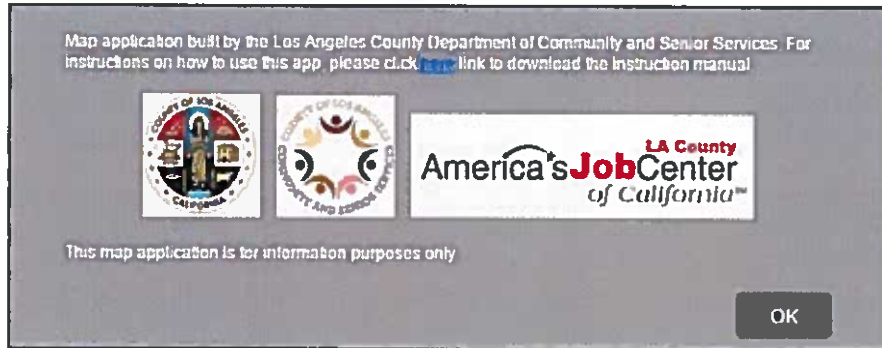




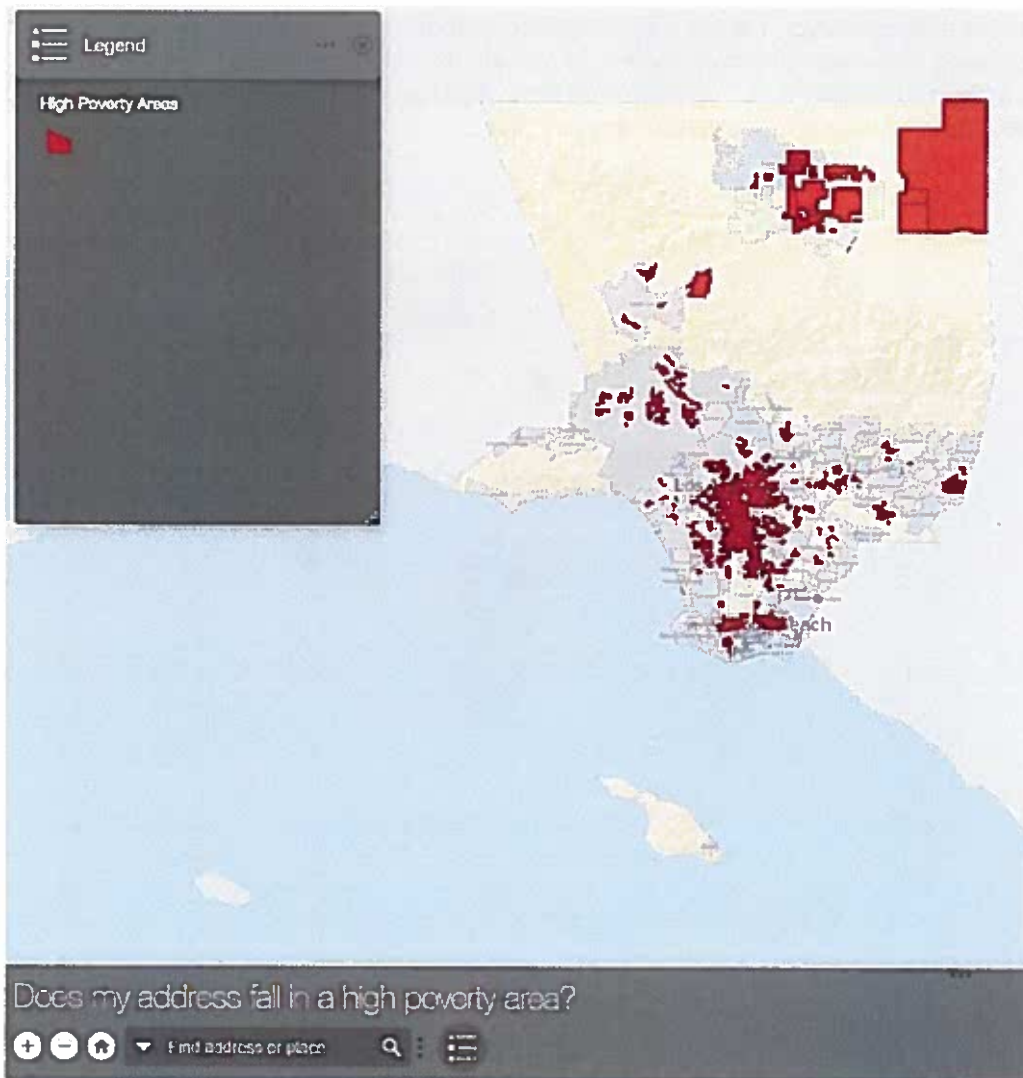
How to use this map application



When you first access the app, a small welcome window will appear, you may click on the "OK" button to continue.

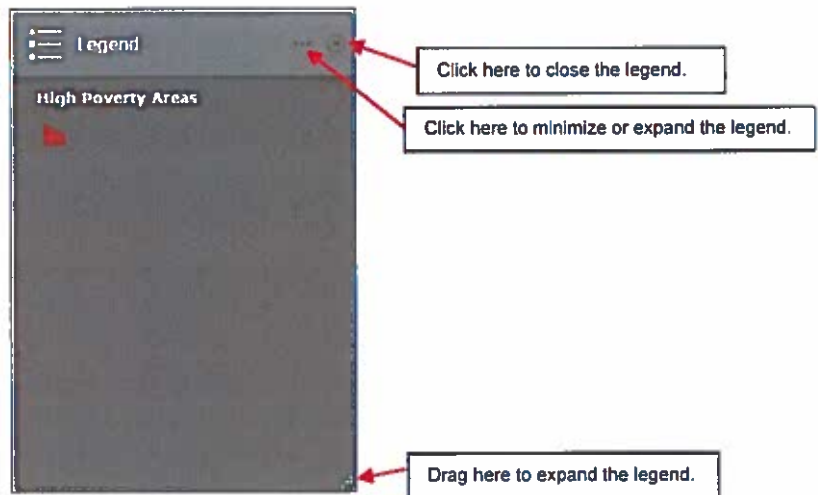


You will next be taken to the map.

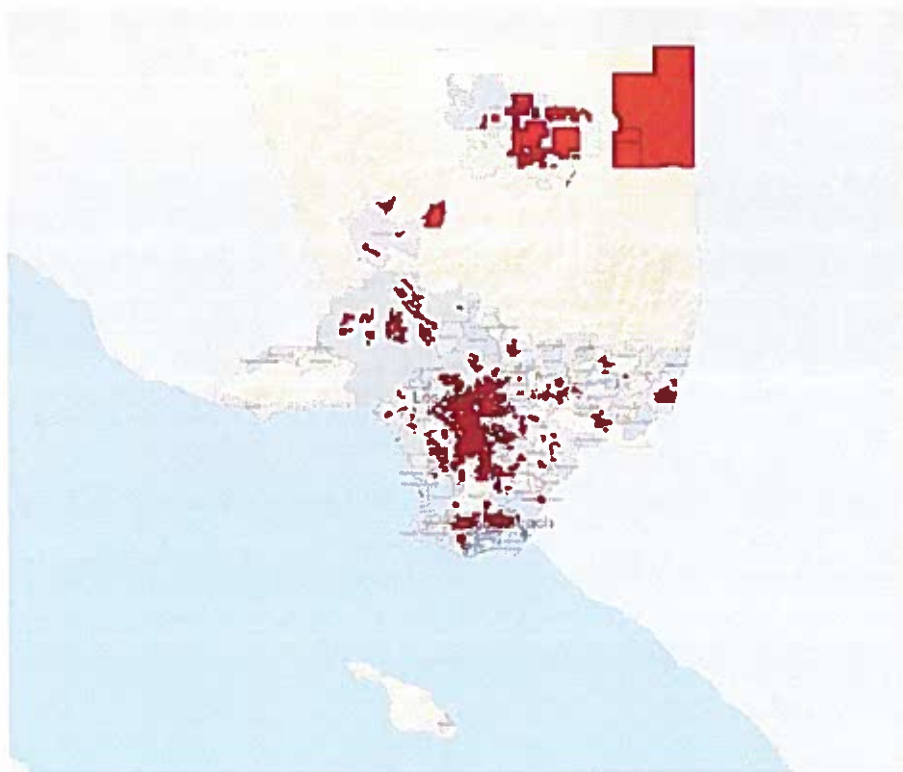


The map application is made up by several components:

The legend showcases the data being presented on the map.

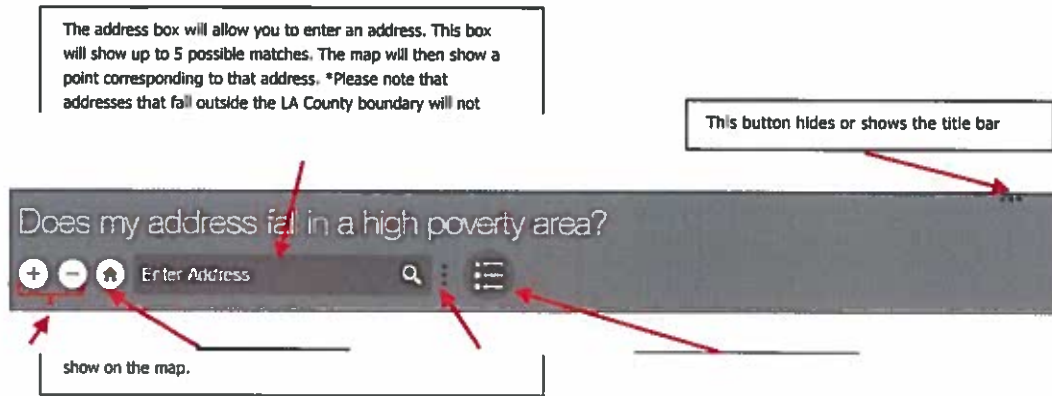


The map is the area where you will see a graphical representation of the Los Angeles County area as well as any data being presented. You may zoom in or out with the scrolling wheel of your mouse (or you can also use the zoom buttons located on the bottom panel), and you may also drag the map by click anywhere on the map and dragging in any direction.



**Please be aware that certain data elements will disappear if you zoom out too much. To correct this, simply zoom in, or click on the button, or the button, both located in the bottom panel.*

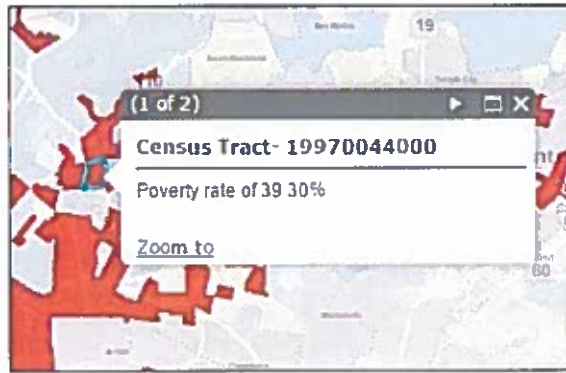
The bottom panel has additional functions for the use of this map application.



- Zoom in or out.
- The home button allows you to visualize the map at its default extent.
- This button hides the widgets to the left. Click again to show them.
- The legend button hides or shows the legend box.

*The **Address Box** accepts full addresses (such as 3175 W 6TH ST, LOS ANGELES, CA, 90020), partial addresses (such as 3175 W 6TH ST), or a zip code.

If you click anywhere in the red areas, the map will show the information corresponding to the area. The red areas are the high poverty areas as defined by the Employment Development Department (EDD). EDD has defined a high poverty area as a Census Tract that has a poverty rate of 25% or higher.
