# **Dislocated Worker Program Fact Sheet**

## **Program Description**

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Dislocated Worker Program provides services to adults aged 18 or over who have been terminated or laid off or have received a notice of termination or layoff from employment. The goal of the Dislocated Worker Program is to assist Participants to re-enter the workforce by providing a menu of WIOA services. All Individuals will be provided access to Basic and Individualized Career Services, Training, placement, and post follow-up services through the America's Job Center of California (AJCC)system and its partners. There is no cost to the services but you must be eligible to receive them.

#### **Services**

**Basic Career Services:** Services are available to all individuals and do not require WIOA registration or enrollment.

- Eligibility determination;
- Outreach, intake and orientation to the AJCC system;
- Initial Assessment:
- O Job search and placement assistance;
- O Referrals to and coordination of activities with other programs and services;
- Workforce and labor market employment statistic information;
- O Training, education, and rehabilitation provider performance and program cost information;
- O Local Area Performance information;
- Information on and referral to supportive services;
- O Financial aid eligibility assistance;
- O Information on unemployment compensation.

**Individualized Career Services:** Registration and enrollment in the WIOA program is required.

- Comprehensive and specialized assessments;
- O Development of an Individual Employment Plan (IEP);
- Group and/or individual counseling and mentoring;
- Career planning;
- Short-term pre-vocational services
- O Internships and work experiences that are linked to careers;
- O Workforce preparation activities-basic academic skills, critical thinking, digital literacy, etc.;
- Financial literacy services;
- Out-of-area job search assistance and relocation assistance;
- O English language acquisition and integrated education and training programs.

**Supportive Services:** Supportive services may be provided to Participants who are receiving Career Services and who are unable to obtain services through other programs to participate in WIOA activities.

**Training Services:** Training services may be provided to Participants who are unable to obtain other grant/funding assistance for such services or require additional assistance beyond the monies available from other grants.

- Occupational skills training, including training for nontraditional employment;
- On-the-job training;
- Incumbent worker training;
- O Trainings in Cooperative Education Programs;
- O Training programs operated by the private sector;
- Skill upgrading and retraining;
- Entrepreneurial training
- Transitional jobs;
- Job readiness training;
- Adult education and literacy activities;
- Customized training
