- Under the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), local workforce development boards must develop and submit to the Governor a comprehensive 4-year plan. Los Angeles County WDB's current Local Plan identifies and describes partnerships, services, and workforce development activities carried out in the County.
- No later than March 31, 2023, the County must submit to the State **a biennial (two-year) update** to the current 4-year Local Plan, which covers July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2025.

Strengthening Community-Based Partnerships

With the implementation of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), federal workforce development programs sent a clear message about the importance of collaboration across an array of federally funded programs.

L.A County's workforce development system has achieved remarkable success in developing and maintaining partnerships with a wide range of federal, state, and local programs that supplement and enhance the efforts of County-administered America's Job Centers of California (AJCCs). Still, there is room for improvement in terms of collaboration with community and grass roots organizations.
