## Jail-Based Job Center Program Fact Sheet

### Program Description

The Jail-Based Job Center (JBJC) is a multi-agency collaborative project, led by WDACS, in partnership with numerous County Departments, including the Sheriff's, Probation, and Human Resources, that provides trauma-informed, gender-responsive pre-release and post-release workforce development services to inmates transitioning from County of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department's (LASD) Pitchess Detention Center-South (PDC-South) back into the community. The JBJC staff will work with LA County AJCC staff to enroll transitioning inmates into training, education, and supportive services, to get former inmates into employment.
